During staff meeting before end-of school year and during pre-school in-service days, the Title I coordinator will review the results of the Spring Parent Survey with teachers and staff so they are aware of the best days and times for parent conferences and events, the methods of communication parents prefer, and other input parents offered to improve parent engagement. This will be followed by training to address why communication is important and suggestions for what needs to be communicated to help engage parents in their child's education. Then teachers will be trained on the use of the technology the school uses to communicate with parents and other means of communication for parents without access to technology.

For the 2022-2023 school year, MKL will incorporate more meetings in the AM and all parent involvement events will take place on the preferred days of Wednesday, Thursday or Friday. Parents would like for events and meetings to be presented Virtually and live. Email, phone call or flyers sent home

were selected as the preferred methods for communication. The parents have stated that their greatest barrier to attending parental involvement meetings is due to their work schedule. The parents would like to have more information about being involved in their child's education through ways that allow for monitoring their child's progress. Per the 2021-2022 Spring Survey, parents feel like faculty and staff need more training in communicating with parents and reaching out to parents. Our last parent involvement event for this year will focus on at-home activities for parents to support learning and reduce regression over the summer months. Additionally, the first parent involvement event for the upcoming school year will provide training for parents on how to use Parent Portal and the Classroom Dojo system to help monitor child's progress and increase communication with parents. We will continue to focus on providing home-school literacy connections for our families. We will provide a STEAM Night event for parents to learn more about Math and Science instruction along with the skills their students need to be successful.
