We addressed parents' needs by holding events during afternoon and evening sessions, holding most events on Thursdays, sending home flyers/newsletters/ communications via Tuesday Take Home folders that are provided to all students. Individuals who need assistance with a parent portal have one-on-ones with the Parent Liaison.

All school communications are translated for our ELL families. Google Translate and staff members assist with this. Our new ADA approved website will translate all uploaded documents. Bilingual staff members assist with conferences and phone calls.
