A. Association of Bay County Educators

Denise Hinson, proud president of ABCE addressed the board:

Always the optimist, I try to find something positive in every situation encountered. Coming into the presidency of ABCE as COVID cases began to rise and the health and safety of all in our schools became top priority, I felt my optimism tremendously challenged and it continues to be each day. This has been a rough year. Teachers are being asked to accomplish more and more in our classrooms for educators are not just educators any longer. We are parents teaching students social skills, character traits, and ethics. We are social workers discussing topics such as bullying, online safety and mental health. We are first responders keeping our students safe each day, practicing active shooter drills and learning how to apply tourniquets and stop bleeding during a crisis until medical professionals arrive. Register shared that he had visited school this morning including Bay High and how impressive the new STEM building construction is looking. He admired the interior painting that Principal Blythe Carpenter and her staff had completed at Jinks Middle School and how far along the construction on the new gym has come. Register also met with MIS Director Jim Scantlin today and he is pleased to have him on our staff.

Chair Steve Moss shared that high school sports have started, specifically football and volleyball. The Mosley football team played Clearwater with over 1500 guest in the stadium. He said they did a good job with social distancing and Mosley won 31-28. Girls volleyball has also started. The county football jamboree had to be moved from Thursday to Saturday due to Hurricane Sally.

Superintendent Husfelt stated that COVID information has been added to the Bay District School's website under a tab on the right-hand side of the home page. This will be updated three times weekly. This will give statistics on the number of cases reported, total number quarantined and the number of schools involved. At this time only 1.2-1.3% of Bay District School students have had to quarantine and no teachers. Teachers are doing an outstanding job of protecting themselves and looking out for the students.
